WHEREAS, restrictions on the purpose or use of funds have NOT been imposed by an external party; and



WHEREAS, the voters within the Riverside Fire Authority have heretofore approved the Plan for the Regional Fire Protection Service Authority; and


WHEREAS, the Governance Board procedural guideline that is part of the plan periodically requires updates and revisions that may be made by the governing body without voter approval; and





WHEREAS, the Governance Board intends to follow a process for selling the property that is open, fair, and in the best interest of residents, property owners and taxpayers of the Authority;



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Authority does not receive at least the minimum value for each item of property listed, the Fire Chief has the discretion to either accept a lower bid or take the item off the list and arrange for a sale at a later date; and



RESOLUTION NO. 2020-05

**A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF RIVERSIDE FIRE AUTHORITY,
DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, RCW 39.04.280 provides ample authority for the Board of this agency to delegate authority to the Fire Chief to declare emergencies when warranted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

The Board hereby delegates full authority, as provided in RCW 39.04.280(2)(b), to the Fire Chief to (1) declare when an emergency situation exists, and (2) after such a declaration, to award all necessary contracts on behalf of the agency to address the emergency situation, without any necessity for competitive bidding and without regard to any existing dollar limitations on the Chief's purchasing authority, **provided** that the board will, no later than two weeks following the award of any such contract, (1) make a written finding of the existence of an emergency and (2) such finding will be made a matter of record in the meeting minutes of the agency.

Section 2.


For purposes of this resolution, an "emergency" means unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of the agency that either: (a) presents a real, immediate threat to the proper performance of essential functions; or (b) will likely result in material loss or damage to property, bodily injury, or loss of life if immediate action is not taken. See RCW 39.04.280(3). Examples of emergencies include, but are not limited to, natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, or volcanic events. If an emergency is declared by Washington State officials, such as the Governor, or by local Mayors in cities annexed for service into the agency, including but not limited to public health emergencies, the Fire Chief may also take that as evidence of an emergency under this resolution.

Section 3.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.





RESOLUTION NO. 2020-06**

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS FOR RIVERSIDE
FIRE AUTHORITY, ESTABLISHING A PLAN FOR CONTINUATION OF
GOVERNMENT IN THE EVENT OF A DISASTER.

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has created a heightened awareness of the need to provide for a plan allowing continuation of essential government services in the event of natural or man-made disasters; and

WHEREAS, the Board is aware that there are various hazards that could lead to a disaster, jeopardizing the operation of the fire authority and the very continuation of the government itself;

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS RESOLVES:

Section 1. This resolution shall be deemed to be the plan of this fire authority for the continuation of the fire authority's governance, in the event of a disaster as defined herein. The intent of the Board is to take an "all hazards" approach to disaster planning. Thus, the cause of the disaster is irrelevant to the working of this plan.

Section 2. The authority has adopted, or will adopt, a plan for the continuation of operations (COOP) in the event of a disaster. Therefore, this plan is limited to providing the basic elements to ensure that the fire authority governing body and essential leadership staff is able to function in an administrative way, so that the operational mission is supported adequately.

Section 3. Definitions.

- A. "Unavailable" means that an incumbent commissioner is unable, by reason of illness, disability, or other reason related to the disaster, to perform the duties of the office of commissioner, for at least 24 hours.
- B. "Vacancy" means that the office of a commissioner is legally unoccupied due to the incumbent's death, incapacity, resignation, or other reason set forth in state statute.
- C. "Available" means and includes the ability to perform the duties of commissioner, either by physically attending meetings or by participating in meetings conducted in part by telephone conference, video conference, or other legal means.
- D. "Disaster" means and includes natural and man-made public calamity, including but not limited to enemy attack, acts of terrorism, pandemic, epidemic, extraordinary hazardous material incident, fire, flood, storm, lahar, volcanic activity, tsunami and earthquake

Section 4. Quorum. In accordance with state statute, for the fire commissioners to hold a lawful meeting of the board of commissioners, a quorum is required. State law defines a quorum to be a majority of the Board. Therefore, on our five-member board, a quorum consists of three commissioners.

Section 5. Appointment of Interim Commissioners. Whenever, due to disaster that causes the fire authority to be unable to convene a quorum of the board due to a commissioner being "unavailable" and not available to participate in a meeting (emergency meeting or regular or special meeting), the Chairperson or other available commissioner may appoint the Fire Chief or Assistant Fire Chief to serve as an interim commissioner. Such appointment shall last only as long as the unavailable commissioner(s) remains unavailable. Only necessary or mission-critical business items will be completed during such interim appointments.

Section 6. Interim Chief. Whenever, due to disaster, the Fire chief is temporarily unable to perform his duties for at least 24 hours, the Assistant Fire Chief or lower ranking Chiefs (in order of succession in the chain of command) shall be appointed by the board to act as Interim Fire Chief, only for the duration of such inability to perform.

Section 7. Vacancy. When a vacancy occurs in a commissioner position, the remaining board members, if available, shall fill the vacancy as soon as feasible, in accord with RCW 42.12.070. A vacancy does not automatically occur due to the temporary disability of a fire commissioner. If no quorum remains due to multiple vacancies, the Lewis County Commissioners shall fill the vacancies in accord with state law.

Section 8. Meetings through Telephone Conference. In the event of a disaster declaration by the President of the United States, the Governor of the State of Washington, or the Chairperson of the Board of Commissioners, the Board may allow participation of available commissioners in Board meetings by telephone. Such participation shall only be allowed, as contrasted to personal attendance, if the disaster prevents personal participation in the duly called meeting.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS FOR THE RIVERSIDE REGIONAL FIRE AUTHORITY (AUTHORITY) PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE AUTHORITY, AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD WITHIN THE AUTHORITY ON FEBRUARY 9, 2021, OF A PROPOSITION AUTHORIZING THE SUBSEQUENT APPROVAL OF A LEVY OF A REGULAR PROPERTY TAX IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FIFTY CENTS (\$0.50) PER THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) OF THE TRUE AND ASSESSED VALUATION OF PROPERTY WITHIN THE AUTHORITY, IN ADDITION TO ITS REGULAR PROPERTY TAX LEVY, AS AUTHORIZED IN RCW 84.52.069, EACH YEAR FOR SIX CONSECUTIVE YEARS, TO BE COLLECTED FIRST IN 2022, AND TO BE COLLECTED IN EACH YEAR SUCCEEDING THE YEAR OF THE LEVY. SAID LEVY SHALL PROVIDE FUNDS REQUIRED BY THE AUTHORITY FOR THE CONTINUED PROVISION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, INCLUDING PERSONNEL COSTS, TRAINING FOR SUCH PERSONNEL, AND RELATED EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES AND VEHICLES.

WHEREAS: The Authority has heretofore received approval by qualified electors of an EMS levy as an additional regular property tax in an amount equal to \$0.50 per thousand dollars of assessed value of property to support the cost of basic emergency medical services provided by the Authority (and advanced life support/paramedic services where applicable); and

WHEREAS: Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in the nation, in Lewis County and in the Authority; and

WHEREAS: It is the judgment of the Board of Fire Commissioners for the Authority that it is essential and necessary for the protection of the health and life of the residents of the Authority to continue providing 24-hour quality emergency medical services within the Authority. Such services necessitate the expenditure of revenues for maintenance, operations, equipment and personnel in excess of those moneys provided by the Authority's regular tax levy, for collection over the next six years beginning in 2022; and

WHEREAS: The Board of Fire Commissioners for the Authority desires to continue providing emergency medical services for the benefit of the citizens and residents of the Authority and therefore supports the proposed six-year EMS levy of up to 50 cents per thousand dollars assessed valuation until more permanent funding can be found for this important life-saving service.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS FOR THE RIVERSIDE REGIONAL FIRE AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. To continue to meet the need for high quality emergency medical services, to satisfy personnel and equipment needs, and to generate revenues adequate to pay costs attributable to providing adequate emergency medical services, the Authority shall levy in 2021, for collection each year for six consecutive years beginning in 2022, a general tax on taxable property in the Authority an amount of up to \$0.50 per \$1,000 of true and fair assessed valuation.

Section 2. Pursuant to the authorization in RCW 84.52.069, as amended, this levy is a regular property tax levy in addition to the statutory tax rate limit of RCW 84.52.043 and is not subject to the limitation of RCW 84.55.010 for the first levy imposed pursuant to RCW 84.52.069(6), but is subject thereto for the remaining fire levies.

Section 3. This six-year levy must be approved by a simple majority of the registered voters of the Authority approving the proposition authorizing the levies, because this levy would be a subsequent approval of the EMS levy heretofore approved.

Section 4. There shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Authority for their ratification or rejection, at an election on February 9, 2021, the proposition hereinafter set forth. The Board of Fire Commissioners for the Authority does hereby declare that the auditor of Lewis County as ex officio Supervisor of Elections, is hereby requested to call said election and to submit the following proposition at said election in the form of a ballot title substantially as follows:

**Proposition One – Riverside Regional Fire Authority
Tax Levy for Emergency Medical Services**

Official Ballot Title: The Board of Fire Commissioners of the Riverside Regional Fire Authority has passed Resolution No. 20-15 to authorize the subsequent approval of the existing EMS tax levy. If passed, Proposition No. 1 would permit the Authority to levy for collection in 2022, and for five years thereafter, an emergency medical services property tax levy at a rate not to exceed \$.0.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation of taxable property within the Authority, which is the same rate authorized for collection in 2021.

The Riverside Regional Fire Authority is placing a measure on the February ballot for renewal of the Authority's emergency medical services levy ("EMS Levy"). Re-authorization of the EMS Levy will continue funding emergency medical services throughout the Authority. The EMS Levy funds will continue to maintain emergency medical personnel, training, equipment, supplies, vehicles and facilities.

Passage of Proposition No. 1 will extend the current EMS Levy for an additional six years at the current rate of up to .50 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. At this rate, the owner of a home assessed at \$200,000 pays \$100 per year to ensure timely emergency medical response and ambulance transportation to area hospitals, when necessary.

Explanatory Statement written by Eric T. Quinn, Attorney at Law.
