New Business

January 2022 Flood Even Briefing

Chief Kytta briefed the board on the January 6-7, 2022, flood event. Discussion followed.

Board of Fire Commissioners Chair/Vice-Chair 2022 Appointment

Commissioner Johnson nominated Commissioner Dolezal to preside as Chair for 2022 and Commissioner Evans nominated Commissioner Coumbs for Vice-Chair for 2022. Commissioner Tomasheck seconded both nominations. Nominations passed 5-0.

Resolution #2022-01 for Emergency Repair at Station 6

Chief Kytta informed the board that during the January 2022 flood event, Station 6 Lincoln Creek incurred damage on the driveway on the west side of the station. Sink holes developed which seem to be caused by subsurface erosion. The chief asked that Resolution #2022-01 declaring an emergency condition exists and authorize emergency repairs to be made waiving the competitive bid process. Commissioner Coumbs made a motion that Resolution #2022-01 for Emergency Repair at Station 6 be approved and authorize the fire chief to enter into an emergency contract for drain tile and driveway repairs at Station 6 Lincoln Creek. Commissioner Evans seconded. Motion passed 5-0.

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Imprest Account Withdrawal Limit

Stephanie informed the board that the daily withdrawal limit on the Imprest Account held at Columbia Bank is \$170,000 a day. With COLAS, more career staff and volunteers opting to use direct deposit for payroll, the amount has now gone over the allotted daily limit. Stephanie asked for authorization to make a request to Columbia Bank to increase in the daily withdrawal limit to \$200,000 a day. Commissioner Evans made a motion² to authorize Stephanie to submit the request. Commissioner Johnson seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
