Background:	<p>The following Aid Unit is being recommended for surplus.</p> <p>#2046 / 1983 Ford econoline VIN 1fdke301xdhb23779</p> <p>This vehicle has responded to 11 requests for service in the last 3.5 years and transported patients only twice. While the vehicle has low mileage, it has become unreliable in several ways. Keeping the heating and cooling system operational in the cab and patient module has proven challenging. The design and materials used in the patient module are not compliant with todays patient care standards or for biohazard concerns. (in example shag carpet side wall pads). The cot is vintage and is only capable of transferring a 350 lb patient and represents a back injury risk when used in comparison to our inventory of modern power cots.</p> <p>We have contacted local fire service agencies to determine if there is any interest to acquire the unit. The only reply has been about taking it from us for the novelty of having a retro ambulance.</p>
Fiscal impact:	No expense, undetermined revenue with call for bids, possibly \$500.00





A RESOLUTION OF THE RIVERSIDE FIRE AUTHORITY, LEWIS COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING PROCUREMENT THROUGH A COOPERATIVE PURCHASING ARRANGEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF TWO-WAY RADIO EQUIPMENT, THROUGH THE SOURCEWELL COOPERATIVE, DIRECTLY FROM MOTOROLA, AND WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING.

WHEREAS, the Board has been advised that the Fire Chief has been provided with a formal legal opinion by legal counsel that the Authority may enter into a cooperative purchasing arrangement with Sourcewell, and that competitive bidding under RCW 52.14.110 is not required in this instance;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

The Authority has identified certain two-way radio equipment, to be purchased through Sourcewell, a Minnesota purchasing cooperative, and legal counsel has issued a formal opinion that such procurement meets and satisfies applicable statutes and the latest guidance from the office of the State Auditor, and therefore competitive bidding is not required under RCW 52.14.110, as the applicable notice and bidding laws of the applicable state (Minnesota) have been followed by the lead agency and/or Sourcewell.

Section 2.

The legal opinion on this procurement shall be maintained on file and attached to this Resolution.





WHEREAS, according to the Washington State Basis of Account and Reporting Manual 3.1.8.50 "If the government's highest level of authority (e.g., board of commissioners, city council, board of directors, board of supervisors, etc.) imposes specific restrictions on the use of resources through the most binding formal action (resolution or ordinance), the unspent portion at the year-end would be considered committed and may be reported as such"; and


WHEREAS, Riverside Fire Authority hereby finds this action to be in the best interest of the public and its resources.





Establishing a Substantial Need for the Year 2022 for General Fund**

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners in the course of considering the budget for 2022 has reviewed all sources of revenue and examined all anticipated expenses and obligations; and

WHEREAS, the population of the District is in excess of 10,000 persons; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, after the hearing and after duly considering all relevant evidence and testimony presented, has determined that Riverside Fire Authority requires an increase in property tax revenue from the previous year, in addition to the increase resulting from the addition of new construction and improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the District and in its best interest; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that, due to projected cost increases for supplies, labor and utilities and other factors, the Board of Commissioners finds that there is a **substantial need** to increase the regular property tax levy rate above the rate of inflation as determined by the national implicit price deflator; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55 limits the property tax increase in a taxing district's tax levy to 1% over and above the previous highest lawful levy, unless the voters approve an increase greater than the limit at a duly-called election as allowed by RCW 84.55.050 and RCW 84.55.0101 as amended; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 84.55.092, it is the further intent of the fire authority commissioners to protect the fire authority's future levy capacity. Therefore, in any year in which the authority reduces the regular tax levy below the amount of levy to which the authority is entitled by law, consistent with existing voter authorizations and the limitations of the state constitution and statutes, it is the authority's intent to fully preserve future levy capacity as the aforesaid statute allows. The county assessor is therefore requested to set the regular property tax levy at the amount which would be allowed under RCW 84.55, as if the regular property tax for the district for taxes due in prior years (beginning with 1986) had been set for the full or maximum amount authorized under the law; and

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of Riverside Fire Authority that the limit factor for the regular levy for the calendar year 2022, collected in the year 2022, shall be 101 per cent of the highest lawful levy of property taxes for such authority, subsequent to 1985, plus an additional dollar amount calculated by multiplying the increase in assessed value in the authority resulting from new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property, and any increase in the assessed value of state-assessed property, by the regular property tax levy rate of the authority for the preceding year, pursuant to RCW 84.55.092 and Chapter 84.55 RCW.



RESOLUTION 2021-09
2022 Budget

**BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE
RIVERSIDE FIRE AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:**

1. That the Lewis County Assessor has notified the Commissioners of the Riverside Fire Authority, estimated population of 23,800 that the assessed valuation of real property lying within the boundaries of said District for the upcoming calendar year of 2022 is \$2,882,425,916 General Fund and \$2,963,660,888 EMS Fund.
2. Pursuant to notice, the Commissioners held a public hearing on revenue sources and expenditures for the district's current expense budget for 2022 on November 17, 2021. At such hearing, the Board of Commissioners considered possible increases in property tax revenues. As a part of the budget process, the Board adopted Resolutions 2021-08, 2021-10, and 2021-11 authorizing increases in property tax revenue, in terms of dollars and percentage increases, both for the EMS Levy and the General Fire Levy.
3. These resolutions attached hereto and made a part of this Resolution, be and hereby is adopted as the budget of Riverside Fire Authority for the calendar year 2022.
4. That the Honorable Assessor of Lewis County, Washington, is hereby requested to make levies for year 2022 for said Riverside Fire Authority of \$4,492,967.02 General Levy and \$1,635,619.36 for EMS Levy.
5. That the Honorable Treasurer of Lewis County, Washington, is hereby authorized and directed to deposit and sequester the monies received from the collection of the tax levies specified in Section 4.
6. That one copy of this Resolution with attachments be delivered to the Lewis County Board of County Commissioners Office who will submit a copy to the Lewis County Assessors Office.
7. Pursuant to RCW 84.52.125, as amended by chapter 196 of the Laws of 2017, it is the intent of the fire district/regional fire authority, acting by and through its board of commissioners, to protect the district's/regional fire authority's tax levy from prorationing under RCW 84.52.010(2), by imposing up to a total of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) per thousand dollars of assessed valuation of the tax levies authorized under RCW 52.16.140 and RCW 52.16.160 [RCW 52.26.140 for RFA's], or either of them, outside of

the five dollars and ninety cents per thousand dollars of valuation limitation established under RCW 84.52.043(2), if those taxes would otherwise be prorated under RCW 84.52.010(2)(e).


